The Arabic program at Mount Holyoke is a part of the Five College Arabic Language Initiative. The coursework focuses on developing skills in reading, writing, listening, and speaking Arabic as well as in Arab culture. The program offers a full year of Arabic instruction; further study is offered through the Five College Consortium. Students can also study abroad in Arabic-speaking countries through fall, spring, or yearlong programs. The McCulloch Center for Global Initiatives maintains a current list of programs offered. Students who study Arabic may choose to complete the minor in Arabic or the major in Middle Eastern Studies for which language study is a principal component.
